Living Resources Art at Crossgates Mall



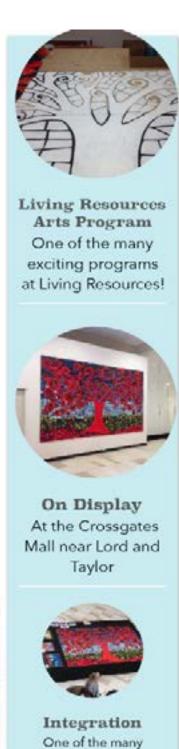
The Arts Program/JCC Capital Capabilities Tree of Life

The 2019 advocacy season has begun and we are pleased to have increased our team by more than 20 staff and individuals. First, we met at our Main Office and determined the needs and concerns of all in attendance, which fell into three main categories; advocating for a fair, living wage for Direct Support Professionals, equal access to public transportation, and equal access to education.

We then participated in the #bFair2DirectCare 2019 Campaign Kick Off held in the New York State Capital in Albany. We joined other self-advocates, family members, Direct Support Professionals, and state legislators in addressing our concerns that Governor Cuomo's Executive Budget proposal fails to include the funding necessary to give Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) a fair, living wage. As Senator David Carlucci said, "If we want people to enter the field, build a career and ensure a high level of care for our most vulnerable populations, then we must act now."

The developmental disabilities community is in a crisis

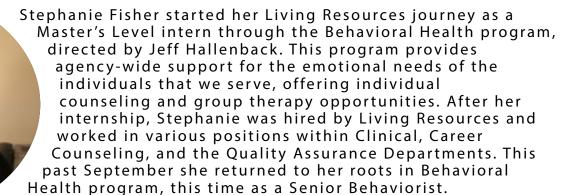
Right now, Direct Support Professionals (DSPs) across New York State are making just above minimum wage and can barely make ends meet, despite the difficult and vital work.

Recently, Stephanie recruited her dog Benjamin to work at Living Resources. Benjamin is a Certified Therapy dog and will begin working with groups in the near future. Therapy dogs can be useful tools in the therapeutic environment. A dog's non judgmental and loving disposition can help a people to feel more calm and open to therapeutic techniques. They can build connections to help people learn more about themselves, facilitate growth of



emotional and social skills, and assist people who are experiencing grief. Interacting with Benjamin is purely optional and will only be entertained with individuals who find the presence of a dog to be positive. Stephanie reports that there is much enthusiasm for dog therapy here at Living Resources and hopes to see this program grow in due time.
