



IDGS: Clinician Direct Check List

- _____ Current script with therapy prescribed and diagnosis codes identified
 - Needed to submit a budget with monies in direct clinical
 - Script is within a year of the last script- does not have to align with budget year
- _____ Therapy can only be at the paid out at the 90% outlined in IDGS grid (back)
 - This is based off professional's credentialing not services provided
 - This is based off of an hour of service- if session invoice is less we need to calculate the hourly rate
 - The invoice cannot exceed the amount outlined by Medicaid- if it does we cannot pay any portion of it
- _____ Obtain and run the providers credentials to assure they are licensed/registered through <http://www.op.nysed.gov/opsearches.htm>
 - If their registration does not come up through this site they can't provide the services
- _____ Therapy plan written by the therapist and signed by primary doctor (this means they are agreeing that this will benefit the individual) This can be provided after we start reimbursement- we should halt reimbursement if this is not provided in a timely manner
 - This should include and evaluation, long and short term goals and how they are going to reach them
- _____ A session note is required for every invoice processed- this would include what was accomplished during that session and is written by the therapist
- _____ Semi-Annual progress note with recommendation to continue therapy- it is easy to tie this with the LP as it does not need to be exactly 6 months- this should be written and signed by the therapist
- _____ Invoice for services stating individuals name, amount of sessions, length of sessions, cost per session, session notes and proof of payment- This is what is uploaded in eVero for reimbursement

All documentation needs to be updated annually when the script expires or the therapist changes
